Congregational Meetings – September 22 and October 6

Your congregation needs the input of each of you as we seek to write a mission statement and core values statement for Oak Grove Lutheran. The results of the Congregational Assessment Tool, indicate that you as a congregation are yearning for direction.

These statements can help!

A **mission statement** defines the church's identity and purpose in a single sentence. A good mission statement creates unity around a common purpose. A mission statement should be clear, concise, and memorable. A **vision statement** is typically a few sentences that describe what the church hopes to become or achieve.

A **core values statement** captures the five to seven things that a congregation holds dearly and deeply. This statement describes the behaviors that will ideally achieve mission, purpose and vision.

Your input is vital in working on these statements! We hope to complete this work through two one hour congregational gatherings after worship on **September 22 and October 6**. As you have responded in the past, I trust and pray that you will respond to this need!

Two Ministry Opportunities

Here are a couple of new ministry opportunities that I hope you will consider:

- 1. Lay Eucharistic Minister A Lay Eucharistic Minister (eucharistic means "thanksgiving" and it is another name for Holy Communion) will share with the pastor in the privilege of visiting homebound individuals and bringing them Holy Communion every other month. Pastor Lee will continue to visit the homebound on the other months. Please let Pastor Lee know if you are interested and willing to serve God in this way. - 2. **Assisting Minister** The Assisting Minister will share parts of the service with the pastor such as: singing or speaking the Kyrie, leading the confession of faith, sharing the prayers of intercession (you do not need to compose these), leading the offering prayer and prayer after communion and the dismissal. The role of assisting minister lifts up our understanding that we are all called to ministry- both lay and clergy. Please contact Pastor Lee if you are interested and willing to serve God in this way. There will be an orientation session for those interested.
