During Advent we wait for power in weakness.


We wait in hope for the Lord; he is our help and our shield.




LORD'S PRAYER

Transition Team Update

In January, Pastor Lee joined us at Oak Grove as Interim Pastor. With two pastors leaving within a year, after being at Oak Grove for 30+ years and other things happening at Oak Grove we were grieving. Pastor Lee did a session allowing us to grieve. He called this phase of our transition "Accept the Ending"- a time of letting go of the past and honoring and grieving the ending but also accepting it. The next stage Pastor Lee talked about was the Neutral Zone. He described the neutral zone as "the no-man's land between the old reality and the new. It is a time when the old way is gone and the new does not feel comfortable yet." This Neutral Zone is where the transition team has been living and hopefully with our monthly updates you too have been there with us. The transition team is coming to the end of our tasks, needing to complete several forms that must go to the synod. We are at a point at Oak Grove when we can begin to think about "new beginnings" as Pastor Lee labeled it. He noted that "people get to the new beginnings only if they first make an ending and have spent some time in the neutral zone." The first task in this New Beginnings phase is to begin the process of forming the Call Committee. The call committee will consist of six Oak Grove members and the President of the congregation – Julie Tvete. We ask that if you are interested, if you would fill out the form titled "Call Committee Interest Form" which you can find in the office on the counter or you can get a form from Julie Tvete.

Forms can be turned into the envelope on the counter in the office or directly to Julie. Forms MUST be turned in no later than December 21st. Call committee will be named in mid-January following the church council meeting.
